Prayer of Adoration

Explanation of Symbol: The anchor is an ancient Christian symbol for hope. It is derived from Hebrews 6.19: "We have this hope as an anchor for the soul..." When combined with a cross it makes plain that Christian hope is in Christ and His redemption. The symbol was frequently used in this sense in the catacombs of ancient Rome.

Perhaps you remember from our study of Psalm 46 that when the Lord says, "Be still and know that I am God," he is essentially telling us to trust in him rather than all the other refuges we are tempted to turn to when we find ourselves in danger. To trust in anyone or anything other than him is not only pointless, since it does not ultimately work; it is also offensive to the God who is both our Maker and Judge of all the earth, which brings us to our Confession of Faith.

Confession of Faith

Is there any way to escape punishment and be brought back into God's favor?

Yes, to satisfy his justice, God himself, out of mere mercy, reconciles us to himself and delivers us from sin and from the punishment for sin, by a Redeemer.¹

Praise God! In the Name of our Redeemer, let us confess our sins together, confidently assured that in him there is both reconciliation and deliverance for all who turn to him in faith.

Confession of Sin

Hear our prayer, O Lord, and listen to our groanings, for we acknowledge our iniquities and lay open our sins before you. Against you, O God, have we sinned; to you we make our confession and implore forgiveness. Turn your face again, O Lord, upon your servants whom you have redeemed with your own blood. Spare us, we pray. Assure pardon for our sins and be pleased to extend to us your loving-kindness and mercy; in Jesus' name. Amen.
