Explanation of Symbol: The Shield of the Holy Trinity is frequently found in stained glass windows of medieval churches. This emblem expresses the doctrine of the triunity of Almighty God, a truth taught in Scripture and affirmed by the Council of Constantinople in AD 381. Positively, two affirmations are made about each person of the Godhead. Reading from the center circle outward: God (*Deus*) is (*est*) Father (P is for *Pater*), God is Son (F is for *Filius*), and God is Holy Spirit (SS is for *Spiritus Sanctus*). Reading from the outer circles inward: the Father is God, the Son is God, and the Holy Spirit is God. Negatively, two affirmations are likewise made about each person of the Godhead. Reading clockwise and counter-clockwise from one outer circle to the other two: the Father is not (*non est*) the Son or the Holy Spirit, the Son is not the Father or the Holy Spirit, and the Holy Spirit is not the Father or the Son.

We begin this morning by praising God who is both our Creator and our Redeemer, the one who made us and the one who saves us. But that raises the question that is asked next in the catechism.

Confession of Faith

What sort of Redeemer is needed to bring us back to God?

One who is truly human and also truly God.1

-The New City Catechism, No. 21

Only the God-Man could atone for our sin and did so by dying on the cross. Let us acknowledge again our continual need for his grace and mercy as we confess our sins together.

Confession of Sin

O Lord, you promised that if we confess our sins, you are faithful and just and will forgive us. Humbly we come, seeking your forgiveness; that we may know the joy of your presence, the light of your face. You alone know our hearts: how often we have offended you, how often we have offended others. Forgive us, Lord, for every unkind thought, every false word, every wrong act. Forgive us, for we have lived not for you, but for ourselves. Forgive us for failing to give you thanks, for our neglect of prayer, our ignorance of your Word, our loss of purpose. Heavenly Father, have mercy on us. Create in us clean hearts, and renew a right spirit within us; by the blood of Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

Silently add your own confession of sin.
