-OBSERVING THE SACRAMENT-

The Lord's Supper

All who are baptized Christians, living under the authority of Christ and his body, the church, are warmly invited to partake of the Supper. Simply tell the elder or deacon who passes before you whether you prefer wine or grape juice. We will wait and partake together after everyone has been served. By eating the bread and drinking the cup, you are acknowledging that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Christ alone for salvation. If this does not describe you, we are glad you are here but commend to you instead the following prayers for your use during this time.

A Prayer for those Searching for the Truth

Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. Guide me, teach me, and open to me the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and leads to the life you promise. Amen.

A Prayer of Belief

Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever believed, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross, and offering forgiveness and new life. I turn from my sins and receive you as Savior and Lord. Amen.

Sermon Notes: "The Mystery of Babylon" (Revelation 17.1-18)

Prayer Concerns

A God to Trust and Lean Upon: Solomon wrote, "Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths" (Pr 3.5-6). In addition to strength and healing, pray that Eric Carpenter, Sandy Cupolillo, Roberta Haer, Judie Jud, Tom Manning, Clint & Elizabeth Miller, and Vickie Myers might trust in the LORD and lean upon him alone this week for all they need.

The Persecuted Church: There are only a few thousand Christians out of nearly half a million people who live in Maldives, a small archipelagic country in South Asia, situated in the Arabian Sea. The Maldives' constitution requires all citizens to be Muslim. Conversion from Islam results in loss of citizenship and severe punishment under sharia law. Even foreign workers who are Christians are closely watched. Churches are outlawed, and openly carrying the Bible is illegal. The country is so tightly controlled by Islamic law that there is not even a Bible fully translated into the native language. Pray that God gives the Maldives' leaders a willingness to condone other religions and opens the hearts of some, in particular, to the gospel. Pray that God leads secret believers to find fellowship with one another and access to the Bible. And with drug abuse becoming the biggest social issue in Maldives, pray that many will turn to Christ and experience true freedom.

Redeemer Presbyterian Church: Pray for Rev. Jeff Glover, our church planter in Soldotna, AK as he shepherds the flock and trains men as officers who will help him do the same.

Alister & Sarah Torrens (Ukraine): Pray for the Torrens as they give themselves to planting a new church in Kiev, for Alister's teaching responsibilities at the seminary, and that God blesses their efforts at reaching out to unbelievers around them.

Explanation of the Cover Symbol

The anchor is an ancient Christian symbol for hope. It is derived from Hebrews 6:19; "We have this hope as an anchor for the soul..." When combined with a cross it makes plain that Christian hope is in Christ and His redemption. The symbol was frequently used in this sense in the catacombs of ancient Rome.
