### The Lord's Supper

All who are baptized Christians, living under the authority of Christ and his body, the church, are warmly invited to partake of the Supper. Simply tell the elder or deacon who passes before you whether you prefer wine or grape juice. We will wait and partake together after everyone has been served. By eating the bread and drinking the cup, you are acknowledging that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Christ alone for salvation. If this does not describe you, we are glad you are here but commend to you instead the following prayers for your use during this time.

### A Prayer for those Searching for the Truth

Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. Guide me, teach me, and open to me the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and leads to the life you promise. Amen.

### A Prayer of Belief

#### **Prayer Concerns**

The Giver of Every Good Thing: Jesus reassured his disciples by saying, "Which one of you, if his son asks him for bread, will give him a stone? Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a serpent? If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask him" (Mt 7.9-11)! In addition to strength and healing, pray that Eric Carpenter, Sandy Cupolillo, Roberta Haer, Judie Jud, Del Klicker, Tom Manning, Elizabeth Miller, and Vickie Myers might have the confidence to ask the Father this week for the good things they need.

*The Inauguration:* Pray for a peaceful inauguration on Wednesday in our nation's capital and in state capitols across the country. Pray for our new President and Vice President, as well as for the new Congress, that God grants them servant's hearts to work for the health our nation.

*Pandemic:* Continue to pray for the healing of those suffering from the virus and that the vaccine proves effective in protecting our healthcare workers and the most vulnerable.

The Persecuted Church: There are 32,000 Christians out of 36.5 million people in Morocco. Although considered relatively tolerant compared to other countries in the region, Christians who talk to others about their faith risk criminal charges and arrest. Converts to Christianity are punished in other ways, such as losing inheritance and custody of children. Pray that laws would change, making it legal for Christians to share their faith. Pray for believers from Muslim backgrounds, as they in particular encounter adversity. And pray for boldness and discernment, as so many daily face the risk of prosecution for simply living out their faith.

Alister & Sarah Torrens (Ukraine): Pray for the Torrens as they give themselves to planting a new church in Kiev, for Alister's teaching responsibilities at the seminary, and that God blesses their labors as they reach out to unbelievers around them.

### **Explanation of the Cover Symbol**

In the Greek language of the early Christian era abbreviations were typically the first and last letters of words, often with a superscription to indicate the missing letters. IC is a standard abbreviation of IHCOYC, the Greek "Jesus," XC the abbreviation of XPICTOC, "Christ"; and NIKA means "He conquers." The symbol then reads, "Jesus Christ Conquers by the Cross: or "Jesus Christ, Victor."
