The Lord's Supper

If this does not describe you, we are glad you are here but commend to you instead the following prayers for your use during this time.

A Prayer for those Searching for the Truth

Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. Guide me, teach me, and open to me the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and leads to the life you promise. Amen.

A Prayer of Belief

Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever believed, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross, and offering forgiveness and new life. I turn from my sins and receive you as Savior and Lord. Amen.

Prayer Concerns

God our Help: We read this promise in Isaiah: "For I, the LORD your God, hold your right hand; it is I who say to you, 'Fear not, I am the one who helps you" (Is 41.13). In addition to strength and healing, pray that Eric Carpenter, Sandy Cupolillo, Roberta Haer, Judie Jud, Del Klicker, Tom Manning, Gunnar McBean, Elizabeth Miller, and Vickie Myers might be filled with courage as they rest in their Helper this week.

Chris & Mary Granberry (White Swan): Pray for the Granberrys and the Sacred Road team as they care for the Yakama people. May their words and deeds convey the love of Christ and the hope of the gospel to many. And may the Lord grant faith to lay hold of it.

Pandemic: Continue to pray for the healing of those suffering from the virus and that the vaccine proves effective in protecting our healthcare workers and the most vulnerable.

The Persecuted Church: There are some 10,000 Christians out of 4.6 million people in Mauritania, a Northwest African country officially known as the Islamic Republic of Mauritania. For Christians, public worship carries a constant threat. Churches must be careful not to be accused of proselytizing Muslims. Baptisms must be carried out in secret, and there is a growing fear because radical Islam is on the rise. Pray for Christian converts from Islam. They face intense pressure from the government, from their families, and from their communities. Pray for the problem of slavery in Mauritania, and for its victims. This heinous reality often stems from religious extremism. Pray for safety and courage for those who fear the rise of more Islamic extremists. And pray for the hearts of radicals to turn to Christ.
