

The Lord's Supper

Sermon Notes: "The Wages of Sin" (1 Kings 14.1-20)

Prayer Concerns

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church: Rev. Craig Harris is planting a church in Yakima. Pray for God's blessings as he gives himself to this new work, and that the Lord leads him to many who are hungry to hear and respond to the gospel.

Jay & Bet Denton (Boise): Pray for Jay and the RUF staff as they engage students on the Boise State campus, that God leads them to those who are eager to consider the gospel, who have believing hearts, and who want to grow in Christian discipleship.

Hoping in God: The psalmist writes, "The LORD takes pleasure in those who fear him, in those who hope in his steadfast love" (Ps 147.11). In addition to strength and healing, pray that Sandy Cupolillo, Roberta Haer, Judie Jud, Del Klicker, Tom Manning, Elizabeth Miller, Vickie Myers, and Samantha Schroeder set their hope again this week in the LORD's steadfast love.

The Persecuted Church: There are 887,000 Christians out of 168 million people in Bangladesh, one of the most densely populated countries in the world, and whose people are predominately Muslim. Those who convert from Islam or tribal religions must gather in small house churches for fear of attack. And those who belong to ethnic minority groups like the Rohingya are doubly vulnerable, since they are harassed for both their religion and their ethnicity. Pray for Christians who are meeting in secret but desire to share their faith despite the risks they face. Pray for believers who have had to flee their communities out of pressure to renounce their faith. And pray for Christians who are mentally and physically abused on a regular basis as they go about their daily routines.

Explanation of the Cover Symbol

The Shield of the Holy Trinity is frequently found in stained glass windows of medieval churches. This emblem expresses the Christian doctrine of the triunity of Almighty God, a truth taught in Scripture and affirmed by the Council of Constantinople in AD 381.
