Gatherings



Sermon Notes: "A Man Just Like Us" (1 Kings 17.1-7)

Prayer Concerns

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church: Rev. Craig Harris is planting a church in Yakima. Pray for God's blessings as he gives himself to this new work, and that the Lord leads him to many who are hungry to hear and respond to the gospel.

The Christian Aid Center cares for many in our community who are hurting and in need. Pray that God continues to convey his love and grace to those they serve.

The Persecuted Church: There are 180,000 Christians out of 5 million people living in *Oman*, an Islamic country on the Arabian Peninsula. Converts to Christianity are pressured by family and society to recant their faith. They can be expelled from their homes, their jobs, and face great difficulties from the government. Expatriate Christian communities are tolerated, but their church facilities are restricted, and Christian meetings are often monitored for political activity. Pray the government will lift restrictions on freedom of expression, assembly, and religion. Pray for new believers who are more likely to face strong societal pressures. And pray that young people who have access to education will usher in a shift toward a more accepting attitude toward Christianity.

Taking Refuge in the Lord: David prayed, "Be merciful to me, O God, be merciful to me, for in you my soul takes refuge; in the shadow of your wings I will take refuge, till the storms of destruction pass by" (Ps 57.1). In addition to strength and healing, pray that Sandy Cupolillo, Judie Jud, Tom Manning, Elizabeth Miller, and Vickie Myers, take refuge in the Lord this week.

Explanation of the Cover Symbol

In the Greek language of the early Christian era abbreviations were typically the first and last letters of words, often with a superscription to indicate the missing letters. IC is a standard abbreviation of IHCOYC, the Greek "Jesus," XC the abbreviation of XPICTOC, "Christ"; and NIKA means "He conquers." The symbol then reads, "Jesus Christ Conquers by the Cross" or Jesus Christ, Victor."
