Sermon Notes: "Christian Busyness" (Colossians 4.2-6)

Prayer Concerns

Hilltop Presbyterian Church: Rev. Jon Neville is planting a church in Ferndale. Pray for God's blessing as he gives himself to this new work, and that the Lord leads him to many who are hungry to hear and respond to the gospel.

The Persecuted Church: There are 1.2 million Christians out of 9.5 million people in the *United Arab Emirates (UAE)*. Christian expatriates are free to worship privately, but the government does not allow them to evangelize or pray in public. Family and community members often try to persuade those who convert from Islam to recant their Christian faith. As a result, converts tend not to reveal their conversion out of fear of being harmed. Pray for leaders of the UAE to have wisdom and tolerance, allowing citizens to change their faith. Pray the government is able to keep the country safe from terrorist groups and provide policies that encourage young people to work for the good of the country. And pray for Christian women who convert from Islam and lose their rights to possessions and their children.

My Portion Forever: The psalmist prayed, "My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever" (Ps 73.26). In addition to strength and healing, pray that Sandy Cupolillo, Judie Jud, Tom Manning, Elizabeth Miller, and Vickie Myers know Christ as their greatest and most treasured portion.

Alister & Sarah Torrens (Ukraine): Pray for the Torrenses as they give themselves to planting a new church in Kiev, for Alister's teaching responsibilities at the seminary, and that God blesses their labors as they reach out to unbelievers around them.

Explanation of the Cover Symbol

In the Greek language of the early Christian era abbreviations were typically the first and last letters of words, often with a superscription to indicate the missing letters. IC is a standard abbreviation of IHCOYC, the Greek "Jesus," XC the abbreviation of XPICTOC, "Christ"; and NIKA means He conquers." The symbol then reads, "Jesus Christ Conquers by the Cross" or Jesus Christ, Victor."
