² "But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it—the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe" (Rom 3.21-22). Prayer Concerns

48th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in America: Some fifteen hundred teaching and ruling elders will meet this week in St. Louis for our annual General Assembly in order to consider, among other things, forty-seven overtures that have been submitted by several Presbyteries. Pray for our deliberations, that they honor God, are faithful to his Word, and are a help to the cause of Christ.

I Am With You Wherever You Go: The LORD said to Joshua, "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be frightened, and do not be dismayed, for the LORD your God is with you wherever you go" (Josh 1.9). In addition to strength and healing, pray that Sandy Cupolillo, Mike Givens, Tom Manning, Elizabeth Miller, and Vickie Myers draw courage this week from God's enabling presence.

The Persecuted Church: There are 33 million Christians out of 270 million people living in *Indonesia*. The church has been wracked with adversity, including deadly suicide bombings and earthquakes that have left Christians reeling. While the government tightens the country's blasphemy laws, most problems for believers and churches come from confrontations with radical Islamic groups that continue to exert significant influence. Pray for believers who are recovering from the loss of family members killed in recent church bombings. Pray for Christian converts from Islam, as they live under tightening anti-conversion laws. And pray that God would open the eyes of Muslim extremists and those exploring radical Islamic ideology, drawing each one to himself.
