-OBSERVING THE SACRAMENT-

The Lord's Supper

We celebrate the Lord's Supper by coming forward (generally from the back of the sanctuary to the front, though you may commune at any time) and partaking of the bread and the cup. Wine is served in the inner rings of each tray; grape juice in the outer ring. We warmly invite to the Table all baptized Christians, who are living under the authority of Christ and his body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking of the cup, you are acknowledging that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Christ alone for salvation. If this does not describe you, we are glad you are here but commend to you the following prayers for your use during this time.

A Prayer for those Searching for the Truth

Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. Guide me, teach me, and open to me the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and leads to the life you promise. Amen.

A Prayer of Belief

Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever believed, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross, and offering forgiveness and new life. I turn from my sins and receive you as Savior and Lord. Amen.

A Prayer for those Struggling with Sin

Lord Jesus, grant that I may see in you the fulfillment of all my need and may turn from every false pleasure to feed on you, the true and living bread. Sermon Notes: "The Helplessness of Man and the Power of God" (2 Kings 4.1-44)

Prayer Concerns

Afghanistan: Pray for the Americans and our Afghan partners trying to leave Afghanistan, that they are kept safe and are soon able to depart.

Hilltop Presbyterian Church: Rev. Jon Neville is planting a church in Ferndale. Pray for God's blessing as he gives himself to this new work, and that the Lord leads him to many who are hungry to hear and respond to the gospel.

Rev. Tom & Melissa Manning arrived in Turkey this week and will be there till September 21, wrapping things up. It is a bittersweet time of saying goodbye to ministry partners and those they have cared for. Pray for their transition, for Tom's continued health, and for the ministry opportunities that await them in Arizona. (They plan to be with us on Sunday, October 24.)

The Persecuted Church: There are 66 million Christians out of 1.3 billion people living in *India*, where the principal religion is Hinduism. Since the ruling party took control in 2014, attacks against Christians by Hindu radicals have increased with little to no consequences. In their view, to be Indian is to be Hindu, so any other faith is viewed as non-Indian. Converts from Hindu backgrounds are particularly mistreated. Pray for strength for them and for all Christian converts who are forcefully pressured to return to their former religion. Pray for God's power and protection over those preaching the gospel in places with anti-conversion laws. And pray that India's leaders would change the laws to allow for more religious freedom.

Strength & Defense: The psalmist prayed, "The LORD is my strength and my defense; he has become my salvation" (Ps 118.14). In addition to strength and healing, pray that Karen Carpenter, Sandy Cupolillo, Mike Givens, Tom Manning, and Rick & Vickie Myers know the Lord as their defender this week.

Explanation of the Cover Symbol

The anchor is an ancient Christian symbol for hope. It is derived from Hebrews 6.19: "We have this hope as an anchor for the soul..." When combined with a cross it makes plain that Christian hope is in Christ and His redemption. The symbol was frequently used in this sense in the catacombs of ancient Rome.
