-OBSERVING THE SACRAMENT-

The Lord's Supper

We celebrate the Lord's Supper by coming forward (generally from the back of the sanctuary to the front, though you may commune at any time) and partaking of the bread and the cup. Wine is served in the inner rings of each tray; grape juice in the outer ring. We warmly invite to the Table all baptized Christians, who are living under the authority of Christ and his body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking of the cup, you are acknowledging that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Christ alone for salvation. If this does not describe you, we are glad you are here and commend to you the following prayers for your use during this time.

A Prayer for those Searching for the Truth

Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. Guide me, teach me, and open to me the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and leads to the life you promise. Amen.

A Prayer of Belief

Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever believed, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross, and offering forgiveness and new life. I turn from my sins and receive you as Savior and Lord. Amen.

A Prayer for those Struggling with Sin

Lord Jesus, grant that I may see in you the fulfillment of all my need and may turn from every false pleasure to feed on you, the true and living bread. Prayer Concerns

Afghanistan: Pray for the Americans and our Afghan partners trying to leave Afghanistan, that they are safe and are soon able to depart.

Boise Presbyterian Church: Pray for Rev. Brian Frey, our church planter in Boise, that God strengthens and directs him as he labors to establish this young congregation.

In Full Confidence: The writer of Hebrews exhorts us, "Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful" (Heb 10.23). In addition to strength and healing, pray that *Sandy Cupolillo, Mike Givens, Tom Manning*, and *Rick & Vickie Myers* this week rest secure in God's love and faithfulness.

Rev. Tom & Melissa Manning returned from Istanbul two weeks ago and are settling into their home in Arizona as they await the arrival of their personal belongings. Tom continues to receive care at the Mayo Clinic in Scottsdale and, for now, he and Melissa will be reaching out to Muslims in the Phoenix area and helping those called to the Middle East prepare for the mission field. We will learn more next Sunday when they are with us, but please keep them in your prayers.

The Persecuted Church: There are only 200,000 Christians out of 40 million people in *Iraq*. Many of them are still recovering from the brutal reign of ISIS. For others, the threat has not yet diminished, especially in the North. Iraq remains very tribal, which means there is significant pressure for believers from Muslim backgrounds, since conversion is seen as a rejection of heritage and family. Pray for those who are recovering from such trauma, that they might be strengthened and grow in grace. And pray for pastors who are desperately needed to care for and feed the saints in this wartorn place.

Explanation of the Cover Symbol

The anchor is an ancient Christian symbol for hope. It is derived from Hebrews 6.19: "We have this hope as an anchor for the soul..." When combined with a cross it makes plain that Christian hope is in Christ and His redemption. The symbol was frequently used in this sense in the catacombs of ancient Rome.
