The Lord's Supper

We celebrate the Lord's Supper by coming forward (generally from the back of the sanctuary to the front, though you may commune at any time) and partaking of the bread and the cup. Wine is served in the inner rings of each tray; grape juice in the outer ring. We warmly invite to the Table all baptized Christians, who are living under the authority of Christ and his body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking of the cup, you are acknowledging that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Christ alone for salvation. If this does not describe you, we are glad you are here and commend to you the following prayers for your use during this time.

A Prayer for those Searching for the Truth

Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. Guide me, teach me, and open to me the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and leads to the life you promise. Amen.

A Prayer of Belief

Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever believed, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross, and offering forgiveness and new life. I turn from my sins and receive you as Savior and Lord. Amen.

Prayer Concerns

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church: Rev. Craig Harris is planting a church in Yakima. Pray for God's blessing's as he gives himself to this work, and that the Lord leads him to many who are hungry to hear and respond to the gospel.

Rev. Jay & Bet Denton (Boise State University): Pray for Jay and the RUF staff as they reach out to students with the gospel and seek to help those who are already Christians grow in their love for God and their understanding of his grace.

The God of Salvation: Jonah prayed, "But I with the voice of thanksgiving will sacrifice to you; what I have vowed I will pay. Salvation belongs to the LORD" (Jonah 2.9)! In addition to strength and healing, pray that Sandy Cupolillo, Mike Givens, Tom Manning, and Rick & Vickie Myers might be filled with grateful praise for all that God has done and is doing for them.

The Persecuted Church: There are some 9 million Christians out of 97 million people in Vietnam, a Buddhist country in which Christians are targeted by both government and tribal leaders. The government tolerates Catholics, but if anyone is thought politically active, they can be imprisoned. In places where religion and ethnic identity are closely tied, Christian converts are often victims of pressure and violence from their families and communities. Pray for those who convert to Christianity and are therefore at risk. Pray they are not deemed a threat by the government. And pray for itinerant pastors to strengthen small churches in rural areas where the gospel and discipleship are most needed.
