Confession of Faith

Which is the Tenth Commandment?

The Tenth Commandment is, "You shall not covet your neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his male servant, or his female servant, or his ox, or his donkey, or anything that is your neighbor's."

What is required in the Tenth Commandment?

The Tenth Commandment requires full contentment with our own condition,² with a right and charitable frame of spirit toward our neighbor and all that is his.³

What is forbidden in the Tenth Commandment?

The Tenth Commandment forbids all discontentment with our own estate,⁴ envying or grieving at the good of our neighbor,⁵ and all unreasonable motions and affections toward anything that is his.⁶

³ "If I have rejoiced at the ruin of him who hated me, or exulted when evil overtook him" (Job 31.29). "Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep" (Rom 12.15). "The aim of our charge is love that issues from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith" (1 Tim 1.5). "Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things" (1 Cor 13.4-7).

The Lord's Supper

We celebrate the Lord's Supper by coming forward (generally from the back of the sanctuary to the front) and partaking of the bread and the cup. Wine is served in the inner rings of each tray; grape juice in the outer rings. We warmly invite to the Table all baptized Christians, who are living under the authority of Christ and his body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking of the cup, you are acknowledging that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Christ alone for salvation. If this does not describe you, we are glad you are here and commend to you the following prayers for your use during this time.

A Prayer for those Searching for the Truth

Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. Guide me, teach me, and open to me the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and leads to the life you promise. Amen.

A Prayer of Belief

Prayer Concerns

The 49th General Assembly of the PCA: Some fifteen hundred teaching and ruling elders will meet in Birmingham this week, at our annual General Assembly, to pray and consider forty-two overtures that have been submitted by several of our Presbyteries. Pray for the deliberations, that they honor the Lord, are faithful to his Word, and advance the cause of his kingdom.

The Gift of Peace: Jesus told his disciples, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid" (Jn 14.27). In addition to strength and healing, pray that Sandy Cupolillo, Mike Givens, Nancy Hoeft, Tom Manning, Rick & Vickie Myers, Rich Parker and Wayne Snavely know and are kept in Christ's peace as they look to him this week.

The Persecuted Church: Christians are but a tiny minority in Niger, where more than 99 percent of the 23 million people are Muslim. Some are able to live and worship peacefully, but others, especially converts from Islam, come under extreme pressure from family and culture and are often targeted by radical Muslims clerics. Pray for those who are suffering under the power of such Muslim leaders, that God strengthens them, that they know his presence and joy, even amidst their suffering, and that God uses the testimony of their lives to awaken in their detractors a hunger for the true and living God.

Redeemer Presbyterian Church: Pray for Rev. Jeff Glover, our church planter in Soldotna, AK as he prepares the congregation for electing elders and deacons, and as he continues to reach out with the love of Christ to those in the Kenai Peninsula.

Ukraine: Pray for an end to the war, that Ukraine remains a free nation, and that God continues to use his people to bring help to the hurting and the lost.

Explanation of the Cover Symbol

The Chi Rho symbol is one of the most ancient Christian symbols. XP, the first two letters of the Greek "Christ," is an abbreviation of the name of the Lord. This symbol is often, as here, accompanied with other symbols, in this case "Alpha" and "Omega," the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet. The symbol originates from Revelation 22.13: "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the First and the Last, the Beginning and the End" (cf. Revelation 1.8, 17; 21.6). This particular symbol dates from the first few centuries of the Christian era and is often found on tombs.
