The Lord's Supper

We celebrate the Lord's Supper by coming forward (generally from the back of the sanctuary to the front) and partaking of the bread and the cup. Wine is served in the inner ring of each tray; grape juice in the outer rings. We warmly invite to the Table all baptized Christians, who are living under the authority of Christ and his body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking of the cup, you are acknowledging that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Christ alone for salvation. If this does not describe you, we are glad you are here and commend to you the following prayers for your use during this time.

A Prayer for those Searching for the Truth

Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. Guide me, teach me, and open to me the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and leads to the life you promise. Amen.

A Prayer of Belief

Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever believed, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross, and offering forgiveness and new life. I turn from my sins and receive you as Savior and Lord. Amen.


Gatherings

Prayer Concerns

Afflicted but Not Crushed: Paul writes, "We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our bodies" (2 Cor 4.8-10). In addition to strength and healing, pray for Sandy Cupolillo, Mike Givens, Nancy Hoeft, Tom Manning, Rick & Vickie Myers, Rich Parker and Wayne Snavely—that the life of Jesus would be seen in them as a result of the difficulties they are enduring in faith.

Boise Presbyterian Church: Pray for the Rev. Brian Frey, our church planter in Boise, as he seeks to develop leaders for this congregation, that together they might become a people who love one another and outsiders well as they continue to grow in grace.

The Persecuted Church: There are only a few thousand Christians out of 37 million people who live in Afghanistan, a tribal society where loyalty to one's family, clan and tribe are extremely important. It is also an Islamic society, meaning it is illegal for an Afghan to leave Islam. Those who choose to follow Christ often do so in secret out of great fear. Pray for those Christians to have courage and perseverance. Pray for a softening of the country's leadership, that conversion from Islam might be permitted. And pray for the spread of the gospel through secret believers and the underground church.

Rev. Alister & Sarah Torrens (Ukraine) are in eastern Washington for a couple months, visiting family and supporting churches (they will be with us on Sunday, August 7). Pray that their time here is restful, that God soon brings to an end the war that made it necessary for them to leave Kyiv, that they are able to return and resume their gospel ministry, and that through them many find eternal hope.

Ukraine: Pray for an end to the war, that Ukraine remains a free nation, and that God continues to use his people to bring help to the hurting and the lost.

Explanation of the Cover Symbol

In the Greek language of the early Christian era abbreviations were typically the first and last letters of words, often with a superscription to indicate the missing letters. IC is a standard abbreviation of IHCOYC, the Greek "Jesus," XC the abbreviation of XPICTOC, "Christ"; and NIKA means "He conquers." The symbol then reads, "Jesus Christ Conquers by the Cross" or "Jesus Christ, Victor."
