### -OBSEVRING THE SACRAMENTS-

### The Lord's Supper

We celebrate the Lord's Supper by coming forward (generally from the back of the sanctuary to the front) and partaking of the bread and the cup. Wine is served in the inner ring of each tray; grape juice in the outer rings. We warmly invite to the Table all baptized Christians, who are living under the authority of Christ and his body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking of the cup, you are acknowledging that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Christ alone for salvation. If this does not describe you, we are glad you are here and commend to you the following prayers for your use during this time.

### A Prayer for those Searching for the Truth

Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. Guide me, teach me, and open to me the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and leads to the life you promise. Amen.

### A Prayer of Belief

Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever believed, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross, and offering forgiveness and new life. I turn from my sins and receive you as Savior and Lord. Amen.

Lord Jesus, grant that I may see in you the fulfillment of all my need and may turn from every false pleasure to feed on you, the true and living bread. ### **Prayer Concerns**

The Persecuted Church: There are 66 million Christians out of 1.3 billion people in *India*, which is a Hindu nation. Since the ruling party took control in 2014, attacks against Christians have become common. In their view, to be Indian is to be Hindu, so any other faith is viewed as non-Indian. Pray for strength for all Christians, but especially for Christian converts who are particularly mistreated. Pray for God's protection over those preaching the gospel in places with anti-conversion laws. And pray that India's leaders would change those laws to allow for more religious freedom.

*Rev. Alister & Sarah Torrens* (Ukraine), along with their children, traveled back to the UK this week in the hope that they would be allowed to stay in Northern Ireland as they wait for it to be safe to return to Kyiv. Pray they are granted permission to do so.

Our Strong Tower: Solomon writes, "The name of the LORD is a strong tower; the righteous man runs into it and is safe" (Pr 18.10). In addition to strength and healing, pray that Sandy Cupolillo, Mike Givens, Nancy Hoeft, Tom Manning, Rick & Vickie Myers, Rich Parker and Wayne Snavely take refuge in the LORD's strong presence this week.
