The Lord's Supper

We celebrate the Lord's Supper by coming forward (generally from the back of the sanctuary to the front) and partaking of the bread and the cup. Wine is served in the inner ring of each tray, grape juice in the outer rings. We warmly invite to the Table all baptized Christians, who are living under the authority of Christ and his body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking of the cup, you are acknowledging that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Christ alone for salvation. If this does not describe you, we are glad you are here and commend to you the following prayer for your use during this time.

Prayer Concerns

Boise Presbyterian Church: Pray for Rev. Brian Frey, our church planter in Boise, as he seeks to develop leaders for this congregation, that together they might become a people who love one another and outsiders well as they continue to grow in grace.

The Pacific Northwest Presbytery is meeting this Thursday and Friday at Evergreen Presbyterian Church in Salem. Pray for travel mercies for the ministers and elders attending, and that their work honors the Lord and is a blessing to the church.

The Persecuted Church: There are 1.2 million Christians out of 30 million people in Nepal. Most of the persecution comes from Hindu radicals who want Nepal to return to a Hindu state. Seen as betraying the faith of their ancestors, Christian converts live under intense pressure. They are often beaten, arrested and sentenced to prison. Pray for the protection of those who live under such daily threats. And pray for the church of Nepal as it gathers, that God uses its leaders and its worship to strengthen the saints and to establish them in the faith.

Unfailing Love: "Though the mountains be shaken and the hills removed, yet my unfailing love for you will not be shaken nor my covenant of peace be removed," say the Lord, who has compassion on you (Is 54.10). In addition to strength and healing, pray that *Paul Carmichael, Sandy Cupolillo, Mike Givens, Nancy Hoeft, Judie Jud, Tom Manning, Rick & Vickie Myers* and *Dani Parker* rest in God's unfailing love in the week ahead.

Explanation of Cover Symbol

In the Greek language of the early Christian era abbreviations were typically the first and last letters of words, often with a superscription to indicate the missing letters. IC is a standard abbreviation of IHCOYC, the Greek "Jesus," XC the abbreviation of XPICTOC, "Christ"; and NIKA means "He conquers." The symbol then reads, "Jesus Christ Conquers by the Cross" or "Jesus Christ, Victor."
