

-OBSERVING THE SACRAMENTS-

The Lord's Supper

We celebrate the Lord's Supper by coming forward (generally from the back of the sanctuary to the front) and partaking of the bread and the cup. Wine is served in the inner ring of each tray, grape juice in the outer rings. We warmly invite to the Table all baptized Christians, who are living under the authority of Christ and his body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking of the cup, you are acknowledging that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Christ alone for salvation. If this does not describe you, we are glad you are here and commend to you the following prayers for your use during this time.

A Prayer for those Searching for the Truth

Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. Guide me, teach me, and open to me the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and leads to the life you promise. Amen.

A Prayer of Belief

Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever believed, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross, and offering forgiveness and new life. I turn from my sins and receive you as Savior and Lord. Amen.

Sermon Notes: "The Spirit and the Christian Life" (Romans 8.1-17)

Prayer Concerns

An Eternal Weight of Glory: Paul writes, "Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day. For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal" (2 Cor 4.16-18). In addition to strength and healing, pray that the eyes of Paul Carmichael, Sandy Cupolillo, Mike Givens, Nancy Hoeft, Judie Jud, Tom Manning, Rick & Vickie Myers and Dani Parker are fixed on the eternal good God is working in them and preparing them for.

Tom & Melissa Manning spent most of November in Turkey and Jordan ministering to couples they had led to Christ in the past, encouraging them in their faith and in their ministries. Pray for the marriages of these couples, that they are protected from the evil one. Pray for their ministries, some of which are moving into new lands and targeting new people groups. And pray for Tom and Melissa as they continue to support and disciple these servants from afar.

The Persecuted Church: There are 180,000 Christians out of 10 million people in Jordan. Though they experience a measure of religious freedom, discrimination in employment and restrictions against free speech still exist. As a result, testimonies of faith by Christian converts can lead to physical violence, arrest, and even death. Add to that, radical Islamic movements, and the threats Christians feel are very real. Pray for those living under such oppression, that they follow Jesus' example as they respond. Pray for protection against radical Islamic groups. And pray for wisdom and courage to be faithful to Christ, no matter what.

Explanation of Cover Symbol

The Shield of the Holy Trinity is frequently found in stained glass windows of medieval churches. This emblem expresses the doctrine of the triunity of Almighty God, a truth taught in Scripture and affirmed by the Council of Constantinople in AD 381. Positively, two affirmations are made about each person of the Godhead. Reading from the center circle outward: God (Deus) is (est) Father (P is for Pater), God is Son (F is for Filius), and God is Holy Spirit (SS is for Spiritus Sanctus). Reading from the outer circles inward: the Father is God, the Son is God, and the Holy Spirit is God. Negatively, two affirmations are likewise made about each person of the Godhead. Reading clockwise and counter-clockwise from one outer circle to the other two: the Father is not (non est) the Son or the Holy Spirit, the Son is not the Father or the Holy Spirit, and the Holy Spirit is not the Father or the Son.
