The Lord's Supper

We celebrate the Lord's Supper by coming forward (generally from the back of the sanctuary to the front) and partaking of the bread and the cup. Wine is served in the inner ring of each tray, grape juice in the outer rings. We warmly invite to the Table all baptized Christians, who are living under the authority of Christ and his body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking of the cup, you are acknowledging that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Christ alone for salvation. If this does not describe you, we are glad you are here but commend to you instead the following prayers for your use during this time.

A Prayer for those Searching for the Truth

Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. Guide me, teach me, and open to me the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and leads to the life you promise. Amen.

A Prayer of Belief

Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever believed, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross, and offering forgiveness and new life. I turn from my sins and receive you as Savior and Lord. Amen.

Prayer Concerns

Saint Andrews Presbyterian Church: Pray for Rev. Craig Harris, our church planter in Yakima, that the Lord strengthens and uses him as he reaches out with Christ's love to many who are hungry to hear and respond to the gospel.

The Carpenter Family: Pray that Eric and his family know God's peace and comfort as they mourn the passing of George.

Rev. Tom & Melissa Manning were very encouraged by Tom's recent PET scan, which showed that his lymphoma had diminished in activity by 50%. In addition to the work he is doing training new missionaries at Frontiers headquarters, Tom and Melissa are also coaching, via teleconference calls, several couples who are leading teams in the Middle East, and in August will be making a trip to Turkey to visit some of them and to expose some younger adults who are considering careers in missions. Pray for Tom's continue health and for their ongoing ministry.

The Persecuted Church: There are 42 million Christians out of 52 million people in Kenya. Though it is a majority-Christian nation, a growing threat of Islamic radicalism exists, particularly in the Northeast and coastal regions where there is a strong al-Shabab presence. Converts in these areas live under constant threat of attack, even from their closest relatives. Pray for the church, that it grows in strength and Christlikeness through the suffering it is enduring. Pray for new believers who are often lured away from the faith by economic enticements. And pray for those who have suffered severe trauma at the hands of radical extremists.

Sufficient Grace: The Lord said to Paul, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness" (2 Cor 12.9). Pray that Sandy Cupolillo, Nancy Hoeft, Judie Jud, Tom Manning, Rick & Vickie Myers and Dani Parker experience this as well, that each finds God's grace sufficient for all of their needs.

Explanation of Cover Symbol

The Chi Rho symbol is one of the most ancient Christian symbols. XP, the first two letters of the Greek "Christ," is an abbreviation of the name of the Lord. This symbol is often, as here, accompanied with other symbols, in this case "Alpha" and "Omega," the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet. The symbol originates from Revelation 22.13: "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the First and the Last, the Beginning and the End" (cf. Revelation 1.8, 17; 21.6). This particular symbol dates from the first few centuries of the Christian era and is often found on tombs.
